

Why is There a Paved Road Going to the Compost Site?

The Compost Site is located within a Tax Incremental District (TID). When this TID was formed, the area produced very little tax revenue for the residents of the Village. Construction of new business in the TID creates new tax revenue.

The Village implemented the TID to increase business and jobs for our community. The additional tax revenue can only be spent inside the TID. This allows the Village to build infrastructure inside the TID, such as the extension of Willow Street, without raising taxes. Only funds, raised from the increase of tax value of new TID properties, paid for the extension of Willow Street. No general tax revenue from outside the district paid for any improvements. The road doesnøt just go to the Compost site, it goes to potential new businesses in the Village and didnøt come from general property tax

2016 Road Construction Plans

This summer, the Village will conduct one road construction project made up of two parts. We will be reconstructing Chestnut Street from Buse Street to Clark Street and we will mill and overlay Madison Street from Roberts Street to Dearborn Street. This project is part of the Villageøs 5 year Road Improvement Plan. The Wisconsin DOT awarded Spencer a \$35,000 grant for this project. The Village is committed to maintaining streets in a cost effective and efficient manner.



Winter Parking Ordinance

Sec. 10-1-31 No person shall park any vehicle on any street or municipal parking lot in the Village of Spencer between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from November 1^{st} through April 1^{st} .

What to do if a Train Derails or Other Disaster Strikes!

The first thing you need to know is that there is a plan in place. Unfortunately, each disaster will require a different plan of action. In the event of a train derailment or other hazardous spill, here are a few things to do until you are informed by emergency personnel what to specifically do or where to go:

- 1. Use your best judgement but in most cases, stay indoors.
- 2. Turn off all HVAC units and extinguish any open flames.
- 3. DO NOT turn ON or OFF any electrical devices!
- 4. Listen for emergency personnel to come around with further instructions.
- 5. If you are asked to evacuate your home, cooperate for your safety and the safety of others.

Safety shelters have been established and you will be notified specifically where you can go depending on the situation.

Spotters, trained by NOAA, monitor the situation when there is a chance of severe weather. If necessary, the siren will sound for 3 minutes to warn everyone to take shelter. No õall clearö signal is sounded.

The state-wide annual tornado drill will be conducted the 3rd week in April.
