The Village purchased approximately 67 acres of land within the Village on July 31st for \$310,000. It is the intention of the Village to develop this land for multi-family housing, senior friendly housing, and single-family housing. Currently, we are working with the engineering firm, McMahon Associates, to look at development options. This will be an ongoing project over the next several years. The Village has already identified a few developers to start building more housing for our community but we need more. project will benefit both the Village and the Spencer Schools.

VILLAGE OFFICE WILL BE CLOSED

The Village Office will be closed Sept. 2nd, Nov. 28th & 29th for holidays. Garbage pick-up will be on Saturday these weeks.

POOL FILLING POLICY

It is the intention of this policy to allow residents to fill a pool and not have to pay the corresponding sewer fee for water used.

The Village will have a water meter for residents to check out who want to fill a pool. A resident will be able to check out the meter for 4 days. The meter will be read before and after checkout to determine the amount of water used. The



amount indicated by the difference of the water meter reads will be deducted on the sewer bill during the billing cycle that the water was used in.

If the resident does not return the meter after 4 days,

the resident is subject to a \$25 per day fine.

The Village will not provide any credit for pools filled without using the Village's water meter.

ACH DIRECT PAYMENT

You can pay your Water/Sewer/Garbage/Recycling bill automatically **with no extra cost** to you. There is no 3rd party involved, the information is processed in the Village Office and runs through the bank process. It requires you

to complete a simple form. Payments are withdrawn on the 15th of each month (unless the 15th is on a weekend or holiday, then it will be the next banking day - never sooner).

PROJECT UPDATES

West Main Street

This September, the Village is replacing the storm-water line on the north side of West Main St. from North Madison St. approximately 400 feet to the west.

• East Willow Street, South Grant Street, East Aspen Street and East Apple Street



The Village has replaced culverts in the Willow, Grant, Aspen, and Apple St. areas. We will be laying new asphalt on Grant St. and 100 feet up Aspen and Apple St., as well as patching the areas on Willow St.

• Cedar Street and Park Street

The Village is replacing the catch basin and improving drainage on this corner.

• Water Break Patches

The Village is patching areas on Douglas St., Park St., Peach St., and County Highway C.
